paid, the receipt of which they do hereby acknowl-
edge granted bargained and sold and by these
presents do sell give and convey unto the said
R. S. Rowntree in trust for the said party of the
2nd part two certain tracts or parcels of land
situated lying and being in the County of Edmonson
on the south of Green River the first contain-
124 acres being the land heretofore conveyed to
the said A. S. Crump by Ro T. Gardner off
of which said Crump has since sold & conveyed
to E. W. Stover five acres, The other tract contain-
600 acres the residue of 1000 acres after conveying
to R. S. Gardner 400 acres thereof, said 1000 acres
was partitioned to Ro Miller conveying him
to Geo Pickett & by A. P. Cox et al for part for

Pickett to said Crump. The conveyances to to make
and of record in the Clerks office of Cameron
County, to which for greater certainty reference
is had, with their appurtenances & also one Negro
Woman named Hannah, aged 35 years, one boy
named James Lewis, aged about nine years, one
other boy named Leander Sampson, aged about
six years. last March, and one girl named Martha
Eliza aged one year & to have and to hold the
said Land and slaves to the party of the 3rd in
trust for the party of the 2nd part, and to their
forever & to the said Crump & wife covenant
and agrees to ever with the said party of 3rd
pay that they will warrant and defend the
said Land and slaves from themselves and all
heirs and from the right title, interest & claim
and demand of all and every person or persons
whatever to the said party of the 3rd part in
trust as aggressor & their heirs forever.
It is further understood and the power and
authority is hereby conferred upon the said Trustee
to bargain sell and convey by deed with General
Warranty and by Bill of sale & Warrant for
such price or prices as he may consider just
and reasonable, when he may think the interest
of the party of the 2nd part shall require it, either
or both the tract of land or either or all the
slaves and their incumbrances convey, and
to best the proceeds in stock or other lands &
slaves as he may consider most conducive to the
interests of said party of the 2nd part or the survi-
vors of said party, making such disposition of said
property or its proceeds as in his estimation
will most advance the interest of said slaves.
It is further intended & determined and the
authority is hereby given to the party of the 3rd
part to appoint such person to succeed him
in his capacity as trustee as he may designate
and deem capable by and with the consent
and approbation of the party of the 1st part alive,
or if dead, of the party of the 2nd part, and the
said person so designated & appointed successor
shall have & possess all the authority in the
premises as the said Trustee before his death
whereof the said party of the first part he
